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THE VOICE OF A WOMAN'S HEART IN ZULFIYAKHONIM'S POETRY

In Zulfiya's work, the image of a woman is embodied in various guises. Sometimes she is depicted as a mother, sometimes as a woman, and sometimes as a selfless person. Each line of the poetess contains an echo of heartache, her words are imbued with feelings that burst from within. Zulfiya was able to reveal the most delicate aspects of a woman's soul in her poems. In her poetry, she did not limit herself to simply describing a woman, but also deeply expressed her inner world, the secrets of her heart, and her feelings. When Zulfiya writes about love, she associates it not only with sweet dreams, but also with patience, loyalty and selflessness. Sometimes the poetess praises happiness through love, sometimes she describes it in connection with separation and longing. Love is not only about joy, it is also mixed with separation, longing and longing. Zulfiyakhanim skillfully reflects this side of love in her poems. Through these thoughts, Erkin Vohidov highlights that Zulfiya is not only a representative of poetry, but also a bright symbol of the culture of the nation. Zulfiya's poetry has a special place not only in Uzbek literature, but also in world literature.

Zulfiya Isroilova's poems are rich in themes such as life, kindness, patriotism, and loyalty. The poem "I Will Sing to You, Life" is also written on such themes, and it is about a person's love for life and the desire to fight for life. This poem tells about the value of life, the difficulties a person faces on the path of life, and the desire to live despite this.

Life is precious, when feelings are fleeting,

Even when you feel sick and weak,

When your heart is burdened by heavy, meaningless thoughts,

In the very first lines of the poem, she writes about the precious feeling of life and how life sings even when it is weak and when your heart is burdened by various thoughts. Through this poem, Zulfiya compares life to a book and emphasizes that a person is the author of his own life. The past is the pages that have been passed, and the future is a chapter that has not yet been written. Through the seasons of nature, the poetess encourages a person to be in harmony with nature and to enjoy every season of nature. Zulfiya likens life to her child, and she experiences sometimes happy and sometimes sad experiences with it. The poetess describes life as a school of learning through her verses in this poem. She skillfully reflects in her poem that life teaches a person through trials and problems, that each day we live is a new page in the book of life, a new experience. In Zulfiya's poem, the verse "I will sing to you, life!" is repeated at the end of each stanza. "I will sing to you, life!" is not only the poet's creative motto, but also an expression of gratitude, gratitude and the desire to live firmly for every person. For Zulfiya, singing life is a deep understanding of its essence and immortalizing it in her poetry. That is why each stanza of this poem ends with the lines "I will sing to you, life!". Zulfiya, as a poet who brought the theme of women and mothers to a high peak not only lyrically, but also on a social and spiritual level, left a deep mark on Uzbek literature.
