

**CLINICAL TERMINOLOGY AS A STRUCTURED COMPONENT OF MEDICAL

The sources of clinical terms, their structural and word-formation features, classification, and functional role in medical education and clinical practice are analyzed. Particular attention is paid to the importance of Greco-Latin elements in the construction of the medical terminology system.

Unlike anatomical terminology, which captures the static structure of the body, clinical terminology reflects the dynamic changes occurring in the human body during various diseases. This determines its functional focus and practical significance.

Historically, clinical terminology was formed on the basis of Latin and Ancient Greek. Latin became established as the international language of medicine, ensuring the universality and stability of the terminological system. Greek, in turn, became the primary source of terms related to the clinical manifestations of diseases, diagnostic and therapeutic procedures. This linguistic interaction contributed to the creation of a logically structured and semantically motivated system of terms.

### Benefits of Clinical Terminology

- **Enhanced Patient Safety.** Reduces errors in diagnosis and treatment by using precise language.

In terms of word formation, clinical terms are distinguished by a complex morphological structure. They are formed by combining root morphemes, prefixes, and suffixes, each with a specific semantic meaning. For example, the suffixes -itis, -osis, -oma, and -algia allow for precise specification of the nature of the pathological process, its course, or clinical manifestations. This structure makes clinical terminology productive and flexible, capable of expanding in line with the development of medical science.

By functional criterion, clinical terminology is divided into several groups: terms denoting symptoms and syndromes; nosological entities; diagnostic and therapeutic concepts; and prognostic and rehabilitative terms. This classification facilitates the systematization of medical knowledge and facilitates the professional training of medical students.

In medical education, clinical terminology plays a fundamental role, serving as the basis for the development of clinical thinking. Proficiency in terminology enables future specialists to correctly interpret clinical information, competently prepare medical documentation, and effectively interact with colleagues. In a physician's practice, the accuracy of terminology is directly related to the quality of diagnosis and patient treatment. Thus, clinical terminology represents a strictly organized system that reflects the scientific level of medicine and ensures professional communication in clinical practice. Its study is a mandatory element of medical training and an important prerequisite for improving the effectiveness of healthcare.
